Alternatives Offered for Clients Served by Suboxone Clinics Involved in Investigation

FRONT ROYAL – The Northern Shenandoah Valley Substance Abuse Coalition has learned that as part of an ongoing investigation the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) executed federal search warrants Wednesday morning at two Suboxone clinics in Front Royal.

Suboxone is an FDA approved medication for the treatment of opiate dependence such as heroin addiction. NSVSAC officials want clients to avoid the risk of relapse, if there is an interruption in treatment, by seeking help at other treatment centers.

Pregnant patients who were receiving treatment from these clinics are encouraged to contact their OBGYN as soon as possible and to avoid potential withdrawal that can lead to pre-term labor.
