Georgia Man Walks Across America to Raise Awareness of Drug Overdoses

A Georgia man will venture through parts of the Northern Shenandoah Valley on his journey across the country in honor of his sister who died of a heroin overdose. Brett Bramble, 31, started his walk across America on March 13th in Delaware. Brett's sister, Brittany Bramble-McNatt died March 15, 2014 of a drug overdose and left behind three children. Brett is hoping to save lives by sharing his sister's story. Today he will walk through parts of Berryville, and he will continue his quest tomorrow when the road takes him through Frederick County and the City of Winchester. His journey will conclude in San Francisco in the fall of 2016. Brett has his dog Domino by his side on his walk.

The Northern Shenandoah Valley Substance Abuse Coalition shares in Brett's passion of bringing awareness about the disease of addiction.
